- Johnson Street Development Proposal William Wells & Eric Ollestad
  - o Eric owns multiple properties in NE
  - Property was zoned R1 and now rezoned Corridor 4 (medium density)
  - o 3-story building, 4 units
  - o Lots of windows on front, great view of park

- Johnson Street Development Proposal (cont)
  - Two entrances in front, two in back
  - Challenges with topography, slopes to alley
  - Added set-back (13' on northside, 8' on southside)
  - 4 parking spaces (covered, green roof)
  - Basement foundation poured concrete
  - Bike parking
  - Plans submitted to city (City's Peter Crandall has provided supportive review)
  - Proposed parking is a variance
  - Eric introduced himself and his intentions for quality
  - Neighbor Brian Smith concerned about parking issues with his garage across the alley – Eric O suggested bollards to protect along Brian's garage
  - Tara S asks what the actual cost is intended to be Eric stated \$2,700-3,000.
  - Robert asked what the timeline is anticipated to be submitting late-May, break ground in September and about 6-8 months to completion.
